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# Southwest Scarf

Free Pattern 2044

Skill level: advanced beginner



## Finished Measurements

Height from cast on to cast off edge:  
approx 7.5 in or 18 cm

Length: approx 42 in or 105 cm

Pattern is identical on both sides.

## Yarn

Misti Alpaca **Pima Silk Hand Paint**

(83% Pima cotton, 17% Silk

Hand Paint 100 g = 327 yds or 300 m  
shown in CSP09 Ambrosia)

1 hank

## Needles

US 4 = 3.5 mm

## Gauge/Tension

18-20 sts garter st = 4 in in width or 10  
cm.

Pattern:

Sl 1<sup>st</sup> st at beg of every row = edge st.

## To knit

CO 37 sts. Work ball edge as follows:

[(k1, p1) until 7 sts in 1 st, (k 1 row,  
turn, p 1 row, turn), rep ( ) 3 times over  
the 7 sts, lift 6<sup>th</sup> st over 7<sup>th</sup> st, then 5<sup>th</sup>  
st over 7<sup>th</sup>, then 4<sup>th</sup> over 7<sup>th</sup> and so on  
until 7<sup>th</sup> st rem, pull yarn to tighten,  
k3], rep [ ] to end of row and end with 1  
ball in last st. Dec 1 st at centre = 36  
sts on ndl.

Cont eyelet pattern as follows:

RS: 3 rows reverse st st (= st st with  
WS to RS of work),

Row 1: 1 edge st, [yo, k2tog], rep [ ],  
end with 1 edge st.

Row 2: 1 edge st, [k2tog, yo], rep [ ],  
end with k1, 1 edge st

Row 3: rep row 1

Cont with [3 rows reverse st st, 3 rows  
st st], rep [ ] once more.

\*\*Then work row 1 and 2 of eyelet  
pattern, [3 rows st st, 3 rows reverse  
st st], rep [ ] once more. Rep from \*\*  
for entire scarf, end with row 1 - 3 of  
eyelet pattern, 3 rows st st.

Inc 1 st at centre = 37 sts. Cast off  
and make balledge at the same time in  
the same manner as for cast on. Note:  
make each ball in the 3<sup>rd</sup> cast off st. If  
neck of ball is too loose, twist yarn  
once around neck before cont cast off.

## Abbreviations

beg = begin/ beginning

CO = cast on

dec = decrease

inc = increase

k = knit

k2tog = knit 2 together

rem = remain/remaining

rep = repeat

RS = right side

Sl 1 = slip one stitch

st/sts = stitch/ stitches

WS = wrong side of work

yo = yarn over

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
